Universität Hamburg's newest Alexander von Humboldt Professor

In summer we received the wonderful news that Distinguished Professor Ingrid Piller has been awarded an Alexander von Humboldt Professorship. With this highly prestigious research prize, Professor Piller will join the Faculty of Education at the University of Hamburg where she will lead and expand the *Literacy in Diversity Settings* (LiDS) Research Centre from January 2025. We wish Professor Piller all the very best with the move (back) to Germany! Although a lateral move within the network, this is a very exciting development that enhances NextGenLit's profile and relations.

Professor Ingrid Gogolin has been elected to the team of Associate Editors of the renowned <u>American Educational Research Journal</u> (AERJ). The AERJ promotes the empirical, theoretical and methodological understanding of education and learning. As one of two international researchers, Professor Gogolin now enriches the Associate Editor team!

Professor Sílvia Melo-Pfeifer is currently on sabbatical at the University of Ottawa (until 22nd December), collaborating with the research group CCERBAL (Canadian Centre for Studies and Research on Bilingualism and Language Planning). During this stay she is continuing her research into the use of art-based research methods in language and teacher education. Professor Melo-Pfeifer is also busy sharing her expertise, not only at the University of Ottawa, but also through guest lectures at the University of Toronto and the University of Calgary.

Professor Yongyan Zheng will take up a short visitorship in January/February 2025 at the University of Auckland, New Zealand. She has been invited by Dr Danping Wang, Senior Lecturer at the Faculty of Arts (Asian Studies). During her visitorship, Professor Zheng will deliver a keynote speech at the "Reimagining Language Education in the Age of AI: Vision and Innovation" forum.

Network members also engaged in intensive, intergenerational exchange in the second round of NextGenLit's international mentoring programme which concluded in 2024.

Support – Network Funding for Emergent Researchers

In 2024 we were able to support NextGenLit emergent researchers to network together and to present their research to international audiences. For example, NextGenLit was well represented at AILA 2024 in Kuala Lumpur. With the theme Linguistic Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Sustainability our members were right at home and, fortunately for those of us who could not attend AILA, recorded their conference highlights for Language on the Move: AILA Day 1, AILA Day 2, AILA Day 3, AILA Day 4.
